

CANONISATION: Blessed Cardinal John Henry Newman will be canonised on Sunday 13 October 2019 in Rome, and this will be a day of rejoicing for the Congregation of the Oratory and for our Archdiocese. Following the Canonisation, there will be a national celebration at Westminster Cathedral as well as events at the Birmingham and Oxford Oratory Churches.

On the Sunday after the Canonisation (20th October at 4pm) there will be an Ecumenical Vespers at St Chad's Cathedral, to which Christian, Inter-Religious and Civic Leaders from Birmingham and across the Archdiocese have been invited. All are welcome.

A Humble Request: On entering the church, one's attention and focus will need to be the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle. As believers in the 'real presence' of the Lord, it is important that the prayerful atmosphere and sacred silence to nurture that prayerful atmosphere of personal communion are upheld and observed always. Hence it is important that talking in church, especially during Eucharistic Adoration and Mass should be avoided. Our kind understanding and cooperation in this regard will be much appreciated. Let us help.

It will also be very much appreciated if all activities on the sanctuary takes place either before the Adoration or after the Adoration is over, not during the Adoration. It is important that the celebrant allows sufficient time after the Adoration and just before the Mass, when the congregation can prayerfully reflect and prepares for the Mass, while those involved in various ministries might do a final check of the books and similar essentials. Thank you very much for your cooperation.

The Church on Mission in the World: October 2019 will be an Extraordinary Missionary Month, called for by Pope Francis, for the purpose of rediscovering the missionary heart of the Church, in all aspects of her life and worship, and especially in every Catholic.

With that in mind, parishes and individuals are being encouraged to express their missionary character in various ways throughout the month.

- **A personal encounter with Jesus Christ alive in His Church through the Eucharist, the Word of God, personal and communal prayer;**
- **Testimony: missionary saints, martyrs and confessors of the faith, as an expression of the Church scattered throughout the world;**
- **Missionary formation: biblical, catechetical, spiritual and theological;**
- **Missionary Charity.**
